Jallikattu as 'right' to be examined

A five Judge Constitution Bench of the Supreme Court will examine whether Jallikattu can get constitutional protection as a 'traditional and cultural fundamental right' under Article 29 (1). A Bench of Chief Justice Dipak Misra and Justice Rohinton Nariman referred a batch of petitions filed by the Animal Welfare Board, the Federation of Indian Animal Protection Organisations (FIAPO) and Compassion Unlimited Plus Action challenging the validity of the law passed by Tamil Nadu to allow Jallikattu in the State. The State had argued that by amending the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals Act to remove Jallikattu from the ambit of PC Act, the State had not sanctified "cruelty".

Bajrang Dal to enroll 25 lakh members

Lucknow: The Bajrang Dal has drawn up a massive expansion plan will be enlisting 25 lakh workers in the organisation by the end of this year. Of these four lakh activists are to be enrolled in Avadh Prant alone. The decision of the Bajrang Dal to enroll new members is apparently designed to make the Ram temple movement more energetic and robust. According to sources, a decision to this effect was taken at a meeting of Hindu outfits in Ayodhya last month. It was said that the court verdict on Ram temple was likely to be known by the end of this year and a large number of youth power would be required to carry forward the temple movement.

Sisters found murdered in UP

Lucknow: In a shocking incident, two cousin sisters, aged 20 and 22, was found murdered and burnt in two separate rooms of their house in Bahpur village in Bulandshahr on Thursday night. The family had gone to Delhi for shopping for a wedding that was to be held later this month and when they returned, they saw smoke coming out of the house. The police was informed and when they went in to the house, they found the burnt bodies of both the girls. The bodies were found without any clothes that indicates that they were raped and then killed. A wire was found around the neck of one of the sisters. — they were possibly strangled to death before being set on fire.

MUFTI READY TO DIE TO SAVE KASHMIRIS

The Chief Minister was reacting to a remark from her predecessor and opposition National Conference leader, Omar Abdullah, who while speaking in the House earlier had invoked the Greek myth about Eros and Psyche to explain the power and money that the BJP government at the Centre given to PDP but taking over the party's soul. Abdullah had suggested to Mufti to go in for tapasya.

Maldivian top court had ordered all political prisoners there to be let off India to Maldives: Abide by SC order

In a clear political message to tiny maritime neighbour the Maldives, India on Friday said that the Maldivian Government must "respect and abide" by Thursday night's order of the Supreme Court of Maldives on "release of all political prisoners" there. New Delhi said this should be done in the "spirit of democracy and rule of law".

New Delhi also made it clear that the safety of Indian nationals in the Maldives should be ensured, adding that it was monitoring the situation. According to various news agency reports, the Maldivian Supreme Court has ordered the immediate

release of exiled former president Mohamed Nasheed and other opposition leaders, terming their trials a violation of the constitution and international law.

India has been unhappy with increasing Chinese influence in the Maldives and previous crackdowns on Opposition leaders by the Maldivian Government. New Delhi has also been upset on the way in which Maldives recently signed a Free Trade Agreement (FTA) with China.

In its reaction, over the "evolving situation in Maldives after order of the Supreme Court of Maldives", New Delhi said, "We have seen last night's order of the Supreme Court of Maldives releasing all

political prisoners. In the spirit of democracy and rule of law, it is imperative for all organs of the Government of Maldives to respect and abide by the order of the apex court. We also hope that the safety and security of the Indian expatriates in

Maldives will be ensured by the Maldivian authorities under all circumstances. As a close and friendly neighbour, India wishes to see a stable, peaceful and prosperous Maldives. We are closely monitoring the evolving situation."

According to some reports, the apex court in the Maldives has ordered new trials, citing the "questionable and politically motivated nature of the trials of the political leaders". However, the international spokesperson at the Maldivian President's office Ibrahim Hussain Shihab was quoted as saying in a statement, "While the ruling makes significant implications on various points of constitutional import and the criminal justice proce-

dures, it was issued without representation of the State from either the Attorney General or the Prosecutor General."

News agencies have reported that the Maldives has seen political unrest and street protests since Nasheed was convicted in 2015 on terror charges and sentenced to 13 years in jail while Nasheed himself was earlier granted asylum by the UK after he was authorised to seek medical treatment there amid mounting foreign pressure. The Maldivian leader, who is currently reported to be in Sri Lanka, welcomed the court order and said Maldivian President Abdulla Yameen must resign in the wake of the ruling by the apex court.

Nagaland poll boycott protest loses steam

With Eastern Nagaland Peoples' Organisation (ENPO), Angami Public Organisation (APO) and Lotha Hoho deciding to go against boycotting the ensuing Assembly polls, the initiative of Joint Christian Forum of Nagaland to defer elections has started fizzling out.

The ENPO, which has refused to follow the dictate of the Core Committee of Nagaland Tribal Hohos and Civil Organisations (CCNTHCO) for boycotting the elections, constitutes six tribes Konyak, Chang, Sangtam, Yinchunger, Kiamngan and Phom.

The ruling alliance, comprising the Naga Peoples Front and BJP, have decided to contest the assembly election, in a reversal of its earlier declaration to boycott the polls in response to a call given by an umbrella group of tribal bodies and civil organisations, which wants solution to the 20-year-old Naga peace process before the poll process.

A day after eight major tribal groups withdrew their support from the poll boycott call, the newly formed Nationalist Democratic Progressive Party (NDPP) has also announced that if others step into the election process, it would also follow suit. "We are likely to contest in about 40 seats," NDPP working president Alemtemshi Jamir said.

The ruling NPF has decided field candidates on 58 seats. Informing that BJP has requested them to leave the two seats of Northern Angami 2 and Tizit, the NPF spokesperson said that BJP state president Visasolie Lhoungu will be contesting from Northern Angami 2, while sitting BJP legislator P Paiwang Konyak will contest from Tizit.

However, co-convenor of BJP Election Management Committee and MLA Mmhomlumo Kikon told this newspaper that they have started discussion on seat sharing with their alliance

Three jawans swept away by avalanche

Three Army jawans died and another was injured when swept by an avalanche in Macheal sector along the Line of Control (LoC) in Jammu and Kashmir's Kupwara district on Friday.

The police and Army sources said that a forward post of the Army's 21 Rajput at Sona Pindi Gali in Macheal sector was hit by an avalanche at around 4.30 pm. Four soldiers were swept by the avalanche and a rescue operation was quickly started, the sources said. However, one soldier was found dead beneath moulds of snow by the rescuers whereas two others succumbed while being taken to the Army's 92-Base Hospital in Srinagar's Badami Bagh Cantonment, the sources said. The deceased have been identified as Havaldar Kamlesh Kumar, Naik Balbeer and Sepoy Rajinder. The condition of the injured soldier Sepoy Bipin is stated to be stable.

The incident occurred two days after the J&K authorities had on the basis of a report received from the Snow and Avalanche Study Establishment (SASE) issued a medium danger avalanche warning of level-3 for higher reaches of Baramulla district and low danger warning of level-2 in Kupwara, Baniptore, Shopian and Kargil districts of the State.

Even before the dust could completely settle over Bareilly district magistrate R Vikram Singh's Facebook posts, another senior officer has now embarrassed the Yogi Adityanath government.

A 1982 batch IPS officer, Mr Shukla is seen in the video clip raising slogans of 'Jai Shree Ram' at an event with other unidentified leaders.

The video shows the pledge being administered by Azam Khan of the Muslim Karsevak Manch.

The IPS officer pledging to construct the Ram temple is a serious matter since the temple issue is still under the consideration of the Supreme Court and Mr Shukla is a serving officer in the UP government. Mr Shukla, meanwhile, clarified, "It was a function organized by the Muslim community to build consensus on the Ayodhya issue and I participated in it. The video has been tampered with and shown out of context without my speech. What I said there was in conformity with the Supreme Court directive which favours out of court settlement".

Sushma visits Nepal as Left gets set to take over

With a pro-China Left government set to take over power after a landslide electoral victory in Nepal, India is pulling out all stops to ensure that it retains its influence in its Himalayan neighbour. Visiting External Affairs Minister Sushma Swaraj "conveyed to all political leaders of Nepal that the Government of India is looking forward to working with the democratically elected Government to take forward bilateral ties to new heights for mutual benefit, and to support the Government of Nepal, as per its priorities, in its endeavours for rapid economic growth and development".

Ms Swaraj is the first high-level visitor from India after the successful holding of Parliamentary and first ever Provincial Assembly elections in Nepal in November-December 2017. During her visit to Nepal, Ms Swaraj called on President of Nepal Bidya Devi Bhandari and Prime Minister of Nepal Sher Bahadur Deuba. She also held meetings with Mr K.P. Sharma Oli, chairman of CPN-UML, Mr. Pushpa Kamal Dahal 'Prachanda', chairman of CPN-MC, Mr Upendra Yadav, president of SSF-N and Mahanta Thakur, coordinator of the Presidium.

Ms Swaraj congratulated the Government and people of Nepal for the successful conduct of three-tier elections in Nepal, which is an important milestone in the democratic transition of Nepal.

HC defers hearing Lalu bail

Jharkhand High Court on Friday deferred hearing on Lalu Yadav's bail plea for two weeks.

The CBI court had convicted Lalu Yadav for offences related to cheating and criminal conspiracy under different sections of the IPC and the Prevention of corruption act.

Lalu Yadav who is serving a jail term for his role in two fodder scam cases had challenged CBI court's verdict in the Jharkhand high court.

His lawyer Anant Kumar told this newspaper from Ranchi that "we had applied for bail which will come up for hearing after two weeks as the High Court wants

to see records of lower court verdict".

The CBI Court had sentenced Lalu Yadav to three and half years in prison on January 6 this year in a case related to fraudulent withdrawal of ₹89.27 Lakh from the Deoghar treasury between 1991 and 1994.

This was the second conviction of RJD Chief Lalu Yadav in the scam that had surfaced for the first time 21 years ago.

He was also found guilty in the third case related to fodder scam on January 24 and sentenced to prison for five years pertaining to illegal withdrawal of ₹33.61 crores from Chaibasa treasury when he was the Chief Minister of Bihar in 1992-93.

"Hearing related to his bail in the Chaibasa treasury case is also likely in another one week time", Lawyer Anant Kumar said. Political observers are of the view that Lalu's trouble may not end with bail in this case as he facing trial in three other fodder scam cases. Hearing in two cases has almost ended and the court may pronounce verdict within few months.

SC denies plea on rape

A three-judge Bench of Chief Justice Dipak Misra and Justices A.M. Kanwilkar and D.Y. Chandrachud dismissed the PIL filed by advocate Rishi Malhotra.
