15 hurt in blast at Hisar oil mill

Hisar: At least 15 labourers were injured, seven of them seriously, when a fire broke out in an oil mill following an explosion in an oil tank on Hisar-Tohana road near here on Sunday, the police said. The explosion in the oil tank took place following a leakage in the boiler, they said. It took five hours for fire brigade personnel from Hisar, Tohana, Barwala and Narwana to extinguish the fire. The impact was so powerful that the roof and walls of the mill crumbled and it soon turned into a heap of debris. All the injured were shifted to Hisar and were admitted to different private hospitals. — PTI

Rally to spread awareness on graft

Hyderabad: A cycle rally "cyclathon" was organised by Air India here on Sunday as part of the "Vigilance Awareness Week" to spread awareness on ill-effects of corruption. Around 80 cyclists took part in the rally, which covered a distance of 22.5 km, a media release issued here said. It started from central raining establishment, Air India, Hyderabad and ending at the same location via Tank Bund, it added. The cyclathon was flagged off this morning by Olympian hockey player Mukesh Kumar. Air India, all over its network is observing Vigilance Awareness Week from October 30. — PTI

₹10 crore lingams seized in TN, 3 held

Erode, TN: Two antique emerald lingams valued at over ₹10 crore were seized in the district on Sunday and three persons arrested in this connection, the police said. Acting on a tip-off, a team of idol wing police led by inspector general Pon Manickavel raided a private lodge here and found three persons in possession of two "maragathalingam" idols estimated to be over ₹10 crore, they said. The idols are suspected to have been stolen from a temple in Namakkal district five years ago, they added. The trio was planning to sell the idols to a person, the police said, adding investigation is on. — PTI

AGUSTA MAY HAVE TO FOREGO ₹3cr GUARANTEE

The VVIP chopper scam is not the only setback for Italian helicopter manufacturer AgustaWestland which may now have to forego a ₹3 crore bank guarantee it had deposited to bid for a tender floated by the Indian Navy to procure 56 naval utility helicopters. The Italian company may have to forego the amount as it has neither deposited it in the court nor given a bank guarantee of a nationalised bank or banks as directed by the high court. The court had made it clear that not complying with its directions, would lead to revocation of the interim order staying the government from invoking the amount. The amount of ₹3 crore was deposited by the company along with the pre-contract integrity pact, which was one of the conditions of the request for technical and commercial proposal (RFP) issued to it by the government. The integrity pact said that if a successful bidder violated the agreement, it would entail forfeiture of the bank guarantee. The Central government standing counsel had told the court that on October 17, 2014, the bank guarantee was invoked and full payment of the amount was demanded as the company had allegedly violated the integrity pact.

'Futile exercise', says Farooq ahead of interlocutor's visit

In a significant development, Jammu and Kashmir's main opposition party National Conference (NC) on Sunday said that the Centre's appointing a new interlocutor on the state was an exercise in futility and wastage of time.

The National Conference president and three-time chief minister Farooq Abdullah said that he was not any optimistic about the Centre's move and has very little expectation from its news interlocutor on Kashmir. Instead, he said, the government should devise a "sound Kashmir policy".

"The appointment of this interlocutor is nothing new. I've very little expectations from him. Like it has been done before, he will come and meet people and eventually nothing will happen," he said. Abdullah who represents Srinagar constituency in Lok Sabha was addressing a rally in Tangdhar area close the Line of Control (LoC) in Kupwara district.

Abdullah's statement is bound to leave an adverse impact on the task assigned to 1979 batch IPS officer and former Intelligence Bureau Chief Dineshwar Sharma who was appointed as the government's representative to hold talks with all

stakeholders in Jammu and Kashmir on October 23. He is scheduled to arrive in the State on Monday on his maiden visit as the Centre's new interlocutor.

Already an alliance of separatists called "Joint Resistance Leadership" (JRL) has termed Sharma's appointment as "nothing more than a tac-

tic to buy time" and announced that it won't meet him.

The alliance which has been calling shots in Kashmir over a period of time and has on it key separatist leaders Syed Ali Shah Geelani, Mirwaiz Umar Farooq and Muhammad Yasin Malik on Sunday while reiterating it said that it won't become part of this "useless talks" process.

Geelani-led Hurriyat Conference in a statement issued here said, "The Hurriyat Conference rejects the facade of talks initiated to kill time. We reiterate that no forum or party from Hurriyat camp will become part of the process."

AI seeks loan to buy VVIP jets

Seeks \$535m loan ■ 2 Boeing aircrafts to be used for ferrying VVIPs

New Delhi, Nov. 5: Air India is looking to raise loans worth \$535 million to finance acquisition of three Boeing planes, including two aircraft that will be used for ferrying VVIPs, a senior airline official said.

Late on Sunday evening, an Air India spokesperson confirmed the PTI report that the two aircraft will be used for VVIP travel. However, the disinvestment-bound carrier has reduced the required loan amount by around \$20 million in less than three weeks after floating a ten-

der where it had sought loan up to \$555 million for buying the three aircraft.

The delivery of three B777-300 ER planes is scheduled to be completed in February next year, with two expected to be bought in January.

Issuing a revised tender, the airline has solicited interest from lenders for loan worth up to \$535 million, for which two separate term sheets would be inked.

At current exchange rates, the loan would be to the tune of around ₹3,460 crore.

Out of three aircraft, two are to be acquired in January 2018 and those would be for the use of VVIPs, the official said.

After making required modifications, the two planes would join the fleet

that are generally used to carry the President, vice-president and PM, the official added. As per the purchase agreement with Boeing, Air India is to buy 15 B777-300 ER aircraft and it has already taken delivery of 12 such planes.

The spokesperson said that Air India had placed an order with Boeing for 68 aircraft in 2005.

"These B777-300 ER airplanes are the last of the three aircraft to be delivered. They are being delivered on January 18 and February 18 by Boeing. — PTI

Cartoonist held over TN CM caricature on usury

Chennai-based cartoonist G. Balakrishnan (36), alias Bala, was on Sunday arrested by the Tirunelveli police for a cartoon critiquing the state government over the death of a family, who self-immolated at the Tirunelveli collector's office on October 23 alleging inaction by authorities over their usury complaint. All four of the family, including two children, died in the incident. The cartoon in contention depicts the Nellore collector, chief minister and the superintendent of police naked and covering

The cartoon depicts Nellore collector, chief minister and the superintendent of police naked and covering their private parts with wads of cash while closing their eyes to a child burning in front of them.

The cartoon was posted on his facebook page, a day after the tragedy which shook the conscience of the state. Tirunelveli district collector Sandeep Nanduri filed a complaint with the dis-

trict crime branch towards the end of October. A FIR was registered on November 1 by the Tirunelveli police who reached the city on Sunday to arrest Bala.

Several plainclothes policemen barged into Bala's residence in Peripanchery, Chennai, and secured him even as his family members confronted and questioned their identity. Police also secured hard drives from his computer. According to Tirunelveli police, Bala was booked under Sections 501 (printing or engraving matter known to be defamatory) of the IPC and Section 67 of the Information Technology Act.

Belgian royal couple arrives on 7-day visit

New Delhi, Nov. 5: King Philippe and Queen Mathilde of Belgium arrived here on Sunday night on a seven-day visit to India with an aim at boosting overall cooperation and ramping up trade and investment ties.

The royal couple was received at the airport by Union urban development minister Hardeep Singh Puri, according to an official of the Belgian Embassy.

According to official data, in 2016-17, bilateral trade amounted to USD 13.28 billion of which exports from India to Belgium accounted for \$5.65 billion while imports from Belgium accounted for \$6.62 billion.

The royal couple will travel to Agra on Monday to visit the iconic Taj Mahal. According to the offi-

cial schedule, the King will meet President Ram Nath Kovind and hold talks with Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Tuesday. On Wednesday, he will attend an India-Belgium business forum meeting.

The King is accompanied by a business delegation of nearly 90 people comprising CEOs of Belgian companies.

On Thursday, he will leave for Mumbai on a two-day visit where he will attend a roundtable of businessmen of the diamond industry and pay a visit to the memorial of the victims of the 2008 terrorist attack. He will also attend a conference which will focus on solutions for smart cities.

The royal couple will leave for Belgium on Saturday. — PTI

12 drown in 2 separate incidents

Twelve people, including children and women, drowned in two separate incidents in Bihar on Sunday. So far, nine bodies have been fished out during a search operation near Raghapur area of Vaishali district. They had gathered for a picnic on the banks of Ganga.

In another incident, a boat carrying 12 persons capsized in Baghmati river in Samastipur district of the state.

Five persons have been rescued so far while three dead bodies were found during the search operation. Bihar chief minister Nitish Kumar announced an ex-gratia of ₹4 lakh each for the families of deceased.

DEAD RODENT ON TRAIN: CLEANING STAFF SUSPENDED

Authorities of the East Coast Railway have suspended the cleaning supervisor of Konark Express after Odisha high court judge Biswanath Rath disembarked the train over foul smell of a dead rodent inside his compartment on November 3.

A disciplinary action against the supervisor has been initiated with serving of a chargesheet by the authorities of Khurda Road division.

Earlier, the HC judge had got down from the train at Berhampur station after facing severe inconvenience due to the pungent smell inside the A1 coach.

VIDEO OF COP GETTING 'MASSAGE' FROM HOMEGUARD GOES VIRAL

Hyderabad, Nov. 5: The Rachakonda police here has ordered an inquiry after a video, purportedly of an inspector getting a "massage" from a homeguard went viral.

After the video was aired on the local TV channels, Rachakonda police commissioner Mahesh M. Bhagwat on

Saturday attached Saroor Nagar police station inspector S. Lingaiah to the commissioner and ordered an inquiry by deputy commissioner of police (admin) Prakash Reddy into the matter.

Though the faces in the blurry video are not clear, the TV reports

claimed that Mr Lingaiah (sitting on a chair) was being massaged by a homeguard in uniform at his house. However, the inspector has denied the charges, saying he is not the man seen in the video, which he termed as fake.

The video appears to have been shot by a constable and a further probe into the matter is underway, the police said. — PTI

5 WOMEN BEATEN ON SUSPICION OF WITCHCRAFT PRACTICE

Suspected of practising witchcraft, five women were tied to a tree and beaten up by a furious mob in Madhupur village in Odisha's Mayurbhanj district.

The incident, which took place on October 22, came to the fore on

Sunday after its video footage went viral. According to sources, some villagers in Madhupur died one after another due to unnatural reasons following which a meeting was held to discuss the probable reasons.

The meeting suspected the involvement of one person of the village behind the deaths.

On suspicion, they thrashed him till he revealed the name of five women allegedly practising witchcraft leading to the deaths.

Annoyed, a few villagers dragged the five suspected women out of their house, tied them to a tree and beat them up severely until the police came and rescued them.

'Ram Rahim & Honeypreet' sold at ₹11,000 at fair

Ujjain (MP), Nov. 5: At the annual donkey fair held in this temple town in Madhya Pradesh, a pair of donkeys named after disgraced sect leader Baba Gurmeet Ram Rahim Singh and his close aide Honeypreet was sold for ₹11,000.

According to organisers, sellers usually give "fancy" names to sell donkeys although their breed and physical features count a lot in cutting a deal. Some traders had named their donkeys after GST, Sultan, Bahubali and Jio.

The pair of donkeys with names of Singh — convicted in two cases of rape, and his adopted daughter Honeypreet — Insan, booked for inciting violence after his arrest — written on them was purchased by a Rajasthan-based trader on Saturday, the last day of the five-day-long fair.

The seller, Hariom Prajapat, who had brought the pair of donkeys from Gujarat,

on Sunday said he wanted to close the deal for ₹20,000, but eventually settled at the lower price. "I couldn't find the buyer who was ready to pay ₹20,000 for the donkeys. Finally I had to sell them at ₹11,000," he said. When asked why he chose to name the donkeys after the jailed Dera Sachha Sauda chief and Honeypreet Insan, Prajapat said he wanted to send out a message that the duo had to pay for their acts. In the annual fair, held near the banks of Kshipra river, the beasts were brought for sell from the states like Mahara-shtra, Rajasthan, and Gujarat besides from Madhya Pradesh. Organisers of the event said around 2,000 donkeys were brought for sale this year. The Ujjain Municipal Corporation (UMC) provided various facilities at the event. — PTI
