Report on the Audit of the Financial Statements

Opinion

We have audited the financial statements of Tempest Wind Energy Private Limited ("the Company"), which comprise the balance sheet as at 31st March 2022, and the statement of Profit and Loss, statement of changes in equity and statement of cash flows for the year then ended, and notes to the financial statements, including a summary of significant accounting policies and other explanatory information.


